Local Flood Risk Management Plan

Options Considered/Reason for Decision

The Flood Risk Regulations 2009 placed a duty on Lead Local Flood Authorities (LLFAs) to produce a Flood Risk Management Plan (FRMP) for all Flood Risk Areas. Whilst no Flood Risk Area was identified Newport City Council joined all LLFAs across Wales in opting to prepare a FRMP to ensure a consistent approach. This work followed on from the Local Flood Risk Management Strategy which was adopted by Newport City Council in December, 2014.

The FRMP gave an overview of the flood risk from local sources, i.e. from surface water, groundwater, ordinary watercourses and the interface with river flooding. The Council's high-level objective was to work to reduce flood risk where significant local flood risk had been identified. Detailed objectives and measures were described which would ensure flood risk was reduced during the next 6 years, after which this plan would be reviewed.

The programme for delivering the management of local flood risk over the 2015 to 2021 period would be dictated by the specific measures required for undertaking such management and availability of resources/funding. The detailed programme of implementation of the specific measures would be developed in the future when the measures had been investigated and prioritised.

Decision

That the Local Flood Risk Management Plan (LFRMP) be adopted.
