#### Education Service Plan 2022/24

#### Options Considered/Reasons for Decision

In November 2022, Newport City Council agreed the delivery of the Council's Corporate Plan 2022-27 to deliver an *Ambitious, Fairer, Greener Newport for Everyone*. To support the delivery of the Corporate Plan, each service area developed their service plan of their objectives and key priorities.

The Education Service Plan 2022-24 identified five objectives which would support the delivery of the Corporate Plan:

1. School Improvement – To improve standards, and progress, for all pupils, in learning & skills through high quality teaching and learning experiences and leadership in all schools.
2. Learning and Engagement – To co-ordinate, support and provide a range of services to ensure equity of opportunity and high-quality provision, to prevent the disengagement of vulnerable pupils
3. Inclusion & Wellbeing -To promote the inclusion and well-being of all pupils with a particular focus on supporting those pupils from vulnerable groups and those with ALN to make good progress in learning.
4. Resources and Planning – To deliver high quality educational facilities and support functions to enable pupils to achieve their potential and support their communities and to expand Welsh medium education provision.
5. Leadership and Management – To further develop a motivated, capable, and engaged workforce and to ensure the effective use of resources by schools.

Additionally, the service plan included the service area's projects and workforce development which would see the continuous improvement of services. To monitor the delivery of services, the Plan also included key performance measures and risks which could prevent the service from achieving its objectives and/or impact delivery.

The Plans would be subject to six monthly reviews by the Council's scrutiny committees and would support the Council's annual Well-being and Self-Assessment Report.

### **Decision**

The Cabinet Member for Education and Early Years approved the Education Service Plan to support the delivery of the Corporate Plan.
