Welsh Government Consultation Response – National Transport Delivery Plan

Options Considered/Reasons for Decision

This report was to update the Leader and Cabinet Members on our proposed response to the Welsh Government Consultation regarding the National Transport Delivery Plan (NTDP) that set out the proposed implementation of the Wales Transport Strategy and to seek approval to submit the response as attached as Appendix A.

The Welsh Government published Llwybr Newydd - the Wales Transport Strategy (WTS) in 2021, which outlined a 20-year vision of the Welsh Transport system and its importance to address climate change. The WTS set out a hierarchy of modes that prioritised the most sustainable modes.

The NTDP set out the Welsh Governments implementation plan for the next five years, recognising some aspirations were dependent on UK government legislation and/or funding. As such the plan as presented, was high level and did not represent a fully funded or committed plan. It did, however set out the likely funding priorities.

Whilst the general aspirations of the plan were consistent with Newport City Council's declaration of a climate emergency, some of the measures considered could result in unintended consequences for the city should they be implemented (for example local road user charging schemes).

Accordingly, the proposed response highlighted our concerns where appropriate.

The Welsh Government consultation, although formally closed, granted Newport City Council an extension to reflect reporting and approval processes.

Decision

This Paper sought Cabinet Member approval to submit the response at Appendix A, which highlighted key issues that impacted on the Authority.
