Adult Services Plan 2022-24

Options Considered/Reasons for Decision

In November 2022, Newport City Council agreed the delivery of the Council's Corporate Plan 2022-27 to deliver an *Ambitious, Fairer, Greener Newport for Everyone*. To support the delivery of the Corporate Plan, each service area has developed their service plan of their objectives and key priorities.

The Adult Services Service Plan 2022-24 identified 4 objectives which would support the delivery of the Corporate Plan:

Objective 1 - Supporting individuals and carers to maintain their independence and support them when they need help by providing equitable access to early intervention and prevention support.

Objective 2 - Ensure safeguarding arrangements for adults and their carers remain robust and NCC remains compliant with the Social Services and Well-being Act.

Objective 3 - Continue developing and improving the sustainability of adult services through a coproduction model with providers, service users and carers to meet our statutory duties, and future demands based upon Population Needs Assessment.

Additionally, the service plan included the service area's projects and workforce development which would see the continuous improvement of services. To monitor the delivery of services, the Plan also included key performance measures and risks which could prevent the service from achieving its objectives and/or impact delivery.

The Plans were subject to six monthly reviews by the Council's scrutiny committees and supported the Council's annual Well-being and Self-Assessment Report.

The Cabinet Members approved the Children Services Service Plan to support the delivery of the Corporate Plan.
