1. Application

On 28th February 2018 a notification under Section 100 of the Licensing Act 2003 giving notice of a 'Temporary Event' was served online to Newport City Council Licensing Authority by Mr Mohammed Rashid for provision of 'licensable activities' of 'the sale by retail of alcohol and the provision of regulated entertainment' at the site of Newport Open Air Market Land at Mill Parade, Newport on 21st July 2018.

In accordance with the requirements for online notification of Temporary Events copies of the notification were sent by email on 28th February to the responsible authorities of Heddlu Gwent Police and Newport City Council Environmental Health Department providing a period of three working days (until midnight on 05th March 2018) during which they may serve notice of objection to the Temporary Event.

2. Temporary Activities

The Temporary event notice details that the premises user intends to provide activities of the Sale of Alcohol and the Provision of Regulated Entertainment between 15:00 hours and 22:30 hours on Saturday 21st July 2018.

The maximum number of people as indicated within the Notice at any one time that will be allowed on the premises during the times when licensable activities take place during the event, including staff, will be 499.

3. Existing Authorisations

The proposed site for this event has no authorisation under the Licensing Act 2003.

Licensing records detail that a similar event was held at the site on 08th July 2017 following service of a Late Temporary Event Notice by Mr Mohammed Rashid on 27th June 2017 that attracted no objection from Police or Environmental Health/Pollution Control Officer

4. Objection Notice

On the 05th March 2018 in accordance the amended Guidance under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 an objection notice (copy attached at Appendix 2) to the Temporary Event Notice was served on the Licensing Authority under the provisions of Section 104 Licensing Act 2003 by Newport City Council's Environmental Health/Pollution Control Officer on the grounds that the event would undermine the Licensing Objective in respect of the, Prevention of Public Nuisance.

This objection having satisfied statutory requirements under the Licensing Act 2003 was served on 05th March 2018 on Mr Mohammed Rashid by way of an attachment to an email.

5. Legal Considerations

- a. The Temporary Event Notification has been served in accordance with requirements of the Licensing Act 2003, Police Reform and Social Responsibilities Act 2012.
- b. The objection to this Temporary Event Notification complies with the provisions of Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 which provides that the Secretary of State must issue and, from time to time, may revise guidance to licensing authorities on the discharge of their functions under the 2003 Act
- c. The police and a local authority exercising environmental health functions have a period of three working days from when they are served a copy of the notice to object to it on the basis of any of the four licensing objectives.

- d. If the licensing authority receives an objection notice from the police or local authority exercising environmental health functions that is not withdrawn, it must (in the case of a standard TEN only) hold a hearing to consider the objection (unless all parties agree that this is unnecessary).
- e. The licensing committee may decide to allow the licensable activities to go ahead as stated in the notice.
- f. Alternatively, it can decide that the event would undermine the licensing objectives and should not take place. In this case, the licensing authority must give a counter notice.
- g. All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must
 - be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees;
 - comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law;
 - be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council;
 - be fully and properly informed;
 - be properly motivated; and
 - be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.

- The objection notice and evidence provided by Newport City Council Environmental Health/Pollution Control.
- Information provided by the applicant.
- The proposed events impact on the promotion of the 'Licensing Objectives'
- To approve the Temporary Event Notification.
- To issue a counter notice if it is decided that the allowing the Temporary Event to proceed would undermine the licensing objective of the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The sale by retail of alcohol

The provision of regulated entertainment 21st July 2018 between 15.00pm - 22.30pm

I can confirm that the above-mentioned Temporary Event Notice was received by the Environmental Protection Team on the 28th February 2018 and allocated to the undersigned on the same date.

I wish to object against this Temporary Event by virtue of Section 182 Licensing Act 2003 (amended guidance).

Due to complaints being previously received during last year's event at the same location, and I am concerned with the likely escape of unwanted noise (loud amplified music) from the event, which was proven to have an adverse impact on nearby residents and therefore, would again conflict with the Licensing Objective in respect of "Prevention of Public Nuisance".

However if the applicant can provide the following information, I would retract my objections to the Temporary Event.

- The applicant needs to specify the mitigation, management measures and environmental and community considerations so as to prevent disturbances to local residents living in the immediate area that are likely to be adversely affected by noise nuisance or other disturbances during every stage of the planned event. Whilst being in compliant with the various statutory obligations placed on event organiser's, including the requirement of both the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.
- The application or organisers needs to confirm what procedures are to be put in place to alleviate
 any possible concerns of others who may be affected by the event and by possible anti-social
 behaviour by those attending event.
- To enable effective management of noise levels, the applicant needs to confirm in terms of possible noise nuisance to the nearby local residents, a pre-event assessment (noise propagation test at the

nearest residential property) of likely noise levels coupled with on-site monitoring and control of noise levels during the event.

- During the event, those involved in monitoring and controlling noise levels need to be able to maintain a dialogue. If complaints are received the applicant and / or the sound engineers needs to be able to adjust the sound systems immediately on requirement and / or as instructed by Senior
- Licensing, Environmental Health or Pollution Control Officer or a duly authorised Officer by Newport City Council. Can the applicant confirm what steps are to be implemented to ensure this is achieved?

However, should the applicant prove the information yet to be submitted to ensure prevention of public nuisance objective is achieved, I would then withdraw my representation.

Should the applicant wish to discuss any of the above they may contact the Licensing Authority.
