1. Name and description of the policy / proposal being assessed. Outline the policy's purpose.

EUSS Document Identity Verification Service (Charging Policy)

This proposal considers the introduction of an over the counter identification verification service for eligible applicants to the Home Office's European Union Settlement Scheme (EUSS). The proposal also considers the impact of charging members of the public £14 (including VAT) to use the service. This charge will not be applicable to individuals under the age of 18.

The decision to charge £14 is based upon the additional demand that the Registrar service may have as a result of offering the service and impact on existing registrar services currently offered to the public in Newport.

2. Outline how you have/will consult with stakeholders who will be affected by the policy/proposal.

In the development of the proposal the Council has consulted with other local authorities that have already established the service in Wales to determine how the service is delivered and the charging policy applied. The £14 charge is a standard charge that has been adopted by different local authorities in England and Wales to cover the cost of delivering the service. We have also engaged with the Community Cohesion team that work with the city's EU community groups and third sector organisations to assess the impact of the service being offered.
