Application

An application made by My Local Convenience Stores Limited under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 for the full variation of a Premises Licence was served on the Licensing Authority of Newport City Council on 28 February 2017. (A copy of the application can be found in Appendix 1 of this report)

In accordance with statutory provisions, copies of the application were served on each of the responsible authorities and details of the application were advertised on the premises and in the South Wales Argus, giving the responsible authorities and any other persons until midnight on 28th March 2017 to make written representations.

A premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 was issued in respect of the premises located at 116A Stow Hill then trading as St Woolos Wine Lodge since the introduction of the Licensing Act 2003 on 24 November 2005; prior to this date the premises held a justices' on licence which was simply converted over into the new licensing regime. (Location and photographs can be found in Appendix 2 of the report.)

A visit by a Licensing Officer to St Woolos Wine Lodge on 11th October 2016 found it have ceased trade and been closed down. This remained the case until 17th January 2017 when Mr Keifer Shea-Godden was granted an application for the transfer of the Premises Licence to himself trading as My Local Convenience Stores Limited for which he is the company director and also specified on the Premises Licence as the Designated Premises Supervisor for the premises.

1. Licensable Activities

The existing Premises Licence authorises the Sale of Alcohol as follows:

Monday to Saturday between the hours of 08:00 and 23:00

Sunday between the hours of 10:00 and 22:30

Good Friday between the hours of 08:00 and 22:30

Christmas Day between the hours of 12:00 to 15:00 and 19:00 to 22:30

The application before the Licensing Sub – Committee seeks to vary the existing Premises Licence as follows:

To extend the times for the sale by retail of alcohol:

Monday to Saturday between the hours of 06:00 and 08:00 and 23:00 – 00:00.

Sunday between 06:00 – 10:00 and 22:30 and 23:00.

To extend the opening times:

Monday to Saturday between 06:00 – 08:00 and 23:00 – 00:00.

Sunday between 06:00 – 10:00 and 22:30 and 00:00

To remove the restrictions for the sale by retail of alcohol applied to:

Christmas Day between the hours of 12:00 to 15:00 and 19:00 to 22:30

Good Friday 12:00 - 22:30

To include the provision of late night refreshment:

Monday to Sunday 23:00 – 00:00

Internal layout changes:

To attach updated scale plans to the premises licence so as to reflect changes in the layout of the counter and shelving configuration within the premises.

2. Mandatory Conditions of a Premises Licence

1 No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or

ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2 Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3 Where at specified times one or more individuals may be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

For the purposes of this section:

i) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies; and
ii) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

- 4 (1) The premises licence holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

{b New Mandatory condition for on and off sales from 28 May 2014}

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(2) In this condition:-

(a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

3. Promotion of the Licensing Objectives

The applicant has described in an Operating Schedule the steps that will be taken to promote the four licensing objectives if the application is granted. These are contained in section M of the application form at Appendix 1 to this report.

4. Representations

Representations in respect of the application were received from the 'Responsible Authorities' of:

Licensing Authority

On 28 March 2017 the Licensing Authority received a representation from the Licensing Authority acting in their capacity as a responsible authority under section 182 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003, a copy of which is included at Appendix 3 of the report. Upon receipt of the representation the applicant confirmed to the Licensing Authority that it was his wish to amend his operating schedule so as to include the 5 conditions detailed in the representation.

The representation was subsequently withdrawn by the Licensing Authority.

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5. Policy Considerations

Relevant extracts of the Statement of Licensing Policy as regards this application include:

IMP 1 The Council will normally grant applications for premises licences and club premises certificates subject to conditions which are consistent with the Operating Schedule and any mandatory conditions prescribed within the Act. Where relevant representations are received the Council may impose additional conditions as considered necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives which arise out of those representations.

IMP 2 The Council will strike a fair balance between the benefits of a licensed premises to a community and the risk of disturbance to local residents. Consequently in certain areas, upon receipt of representations by any Responsible Authority or any other person, the Council may restrict the hours of operation of licensable activities.

IMP 3 The Council will normally grant premises licences for a time period of not earlier than 10.00 a.m. and a terminal hour of no later than 11.30 p.m. for those premises licensed to sell alcohol for consumption on the premises and which are located in primarily residential areas. However, hours beyond 11.30 p.m. may be permitted:

- a. for premises located in predominantly commercial areas, such as the City Centre and where there is a high level of accessibility to public transport services;
or
- b. the licensable activities would not be likely to cause adverse impact especially on local residents, and that, if there is a potential to cause adverse impact, appropriate measures will be put in place to prevent it;
or

- c. there will not be any increase in the cumulative adverse impact from these or similar activities, on any neighbouring residential area and the activity will not be likely to lead to a demonstrable increase in car parking demand in surrounding residential streets or on roads.

G2 The Council will attach conditions to licences, which are tailored to the individual style and characteristics of the premises. Such conditions will normally be drawn from the Council's pool of conditions. Where appropriate, additional conditions will be formulated based on an individual case following receipt of relevant representations.

6. Legal Considerations

The decision must be taken following consideration of the representations received with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:

- a. Prevention of crime and disorder
- b. Public Safety
- c. Prevention of Public Nuisance
- d. Protection of Children from Harm

In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination:

- a. To grant the application as applied
- b. To grant the application and modify what is requested by the application in respect of activities, times and conditions, by altering, omitting or adding to them, where relevant.
- c. Reject the whole or part of the application.

All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must

- a. be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees;
- b. comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law;
- c. be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council eg. standing orders and financial regulations;
- d. be fully and properly informed;
- e. be properly motivated;
- f. be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and
- g. be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.

- a) The proposed increase in permitted hours for the sale by retail of alcohol sought by the application.
- b) The content of the existing operating schedule and amendment to conditions in promoting the four licensing objectives
- c) The representations made in respect of the application.
- d) Newport City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy
- e) Any conditions that are required by the Panel to be attached to the Premises Licence in order to promote the four Licensing Objectives, in light of the information contained in the applicant's operating schedule and representations received.

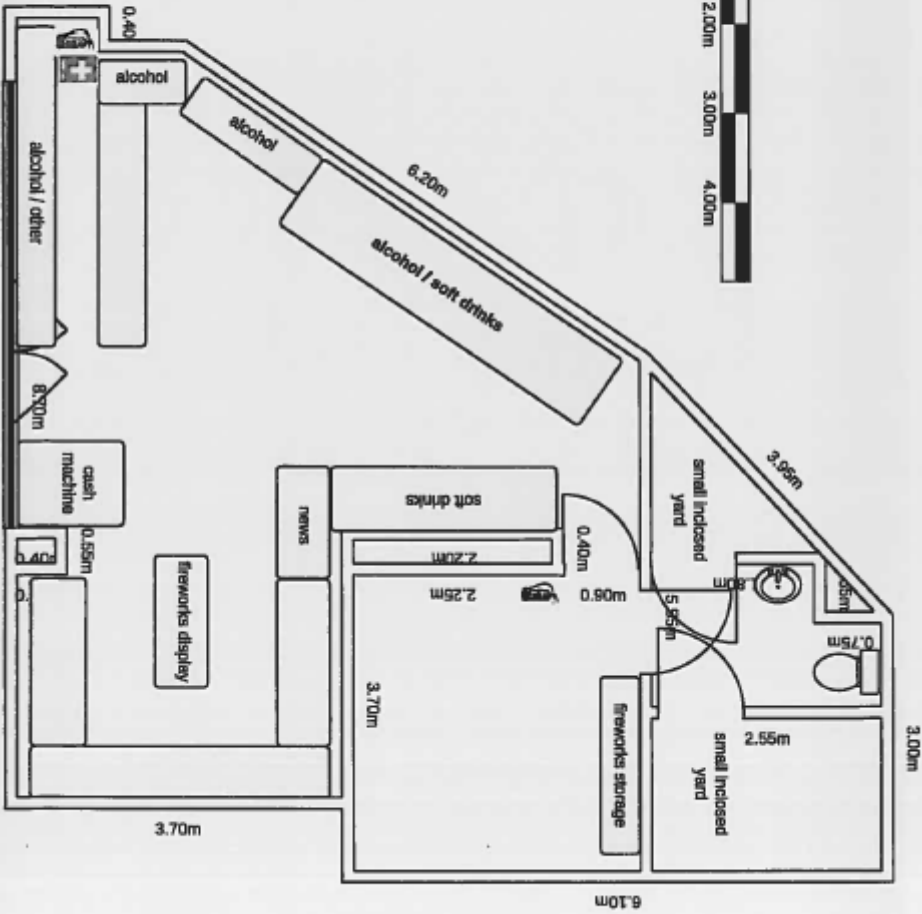

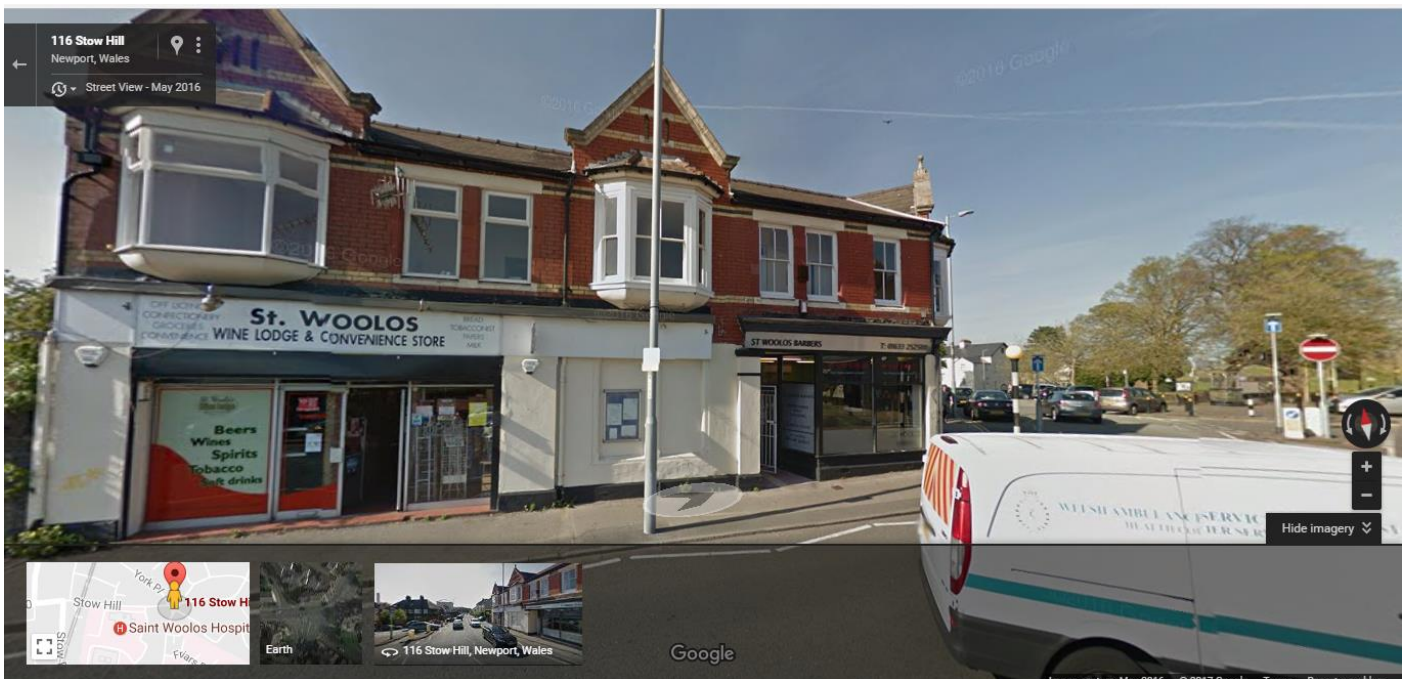

SECTION 69 LICENSING ACT 2003: NOTICE OF OBJECTION

TO AN APPLICATION UNDER SECTION 34 LICENSING ACT 2003 FOR A FULL VARIATION OF A PREMISES LICENCE IN RESPECT OF '116A Stow Hill, Newport, NP20 4GA', served upon the Licensing Authority on 28 February 2017.

Newport City Council's Licensing Authority acting in their capacity as a 'Responsible Authority' by virtue of section 182 (4) Licensing Act 2003 (amended guidance) wish to object to the full variation of a Premises Licence as detailed above on the grounds that the application does not provide clear, measurable and enforceable provisions for promotion of the four 'licensing objectives' of:

- Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- Public Protection
- Protection of Children from Harm

In this respect the Licensing Authority acting in their role as a '**responsible authority**' would withdraw their representation if the applicant volunteered the following conditions in addition to those which were proposed within the application, to be attached to the premises licence, if the variation is granted, in order to promote the 'licensing objectives'.

1. CCTV will be installed inside and outside the premises. The cameras will cover all internal areas accessible to the public and areas immediately outside the premises and any storage rooms. The date and time settings on the system must be correct and the CCTV system must be capable of recording images to a suitable medium that allows replay. Recordings must be retained for a minimum of 28 days. Staff shall be trained in the maintenance and operation of the CCTV system with a record kept of the date and name of person trained. A trained member of staff should be on duty to operate the system whenever the premises are open. Records shall be made available for inspection by the police and other responsible authorities as requested.

2. A refusal book shall be kept at the store and all refusals recorded, with staff required to enter details of time/date/individual/product refused and why, the DPS must counter sign the book every 4 weeks.
3. On occasion of deliveries of alcoholic drinks and products the delivery drivers shall be equipped with a refusal book and record details of refused deliveries to include the address/time/date/individual/product reason for refusal. The DPS must counter sign this refusal book every 4 weeks.
4. All staff selling alcohol should be briefed on the premises Licensing Conditions. A log should be kept of the date and name person briefed and made available for inspection by a responsible authority. A documented training scheme shall be introduced for all staff. The scheme shall be made available for inspection at the request of any Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003
5. Whenever a designated premises supervisor is not at the premises, another individual must be nominated as being the responsible person nominated by the designated premises supervisor to manage the premises and they must have the contact details of the designated premises supervisor.
